

Thorpe next Norwich Parish Council.

BYE-LAWS

Made by the Parish Council of the Parish of Thorpe (next Norwich) for the Regulation of the Recreation Ground known as "RIVER GREEN."

1. Throughout these Bye-Laws the word "Council" shall mean the Parish Council for the time being of the Parish of Thorpe next Norwich.

2. No person shall improperly remove or carelessly or negligently deface, injure or destroy any building, monument, ornament or decoration, any fixed or movable seat, post, gate, barrier, wall piling, fence, tree, shrub, turf, or any board, plate or table used for the exhibition of any Bye-Law or Notice fixed or set up by a duly authorised Officer of the Council in the River Green.

3. No person shall put up, fix or exhibit any advertisement, posting bill, placard or Notice upon any part of the River Green, or the railings or fence thereof except that any duly authorised Officer of the Council may fix and put up any Bye-Law or legal Notice relating to the Parish on the proper Notice Board provided for the same.

4. No person shall on any part of the River Green take, injure or destroy any bird or nest or spread or use any net or set or use any snare or trap or other means for the taking, injuring, or destruction of any bird.

5. No person, except such authorised Officer or Servant of the Council for any purpose duly authorised by the Council, shall remove or disturb any part of the soil or turf in any part of the River Green.

6. No person shall throw or deposit any filth, rubbish or refuse on any part of the River Green.

7. No person shall without the consent of the Council erect any post, rail, barrier, seat, pole, tent, booth, stand, or any building or erection of any kind whatever in the River Green.

8. No person except a person employed in connection with the laying out, planting or improvement or maintenance of the River Green shall burn or cause to be burnt any gorse, furse or other substance therein.

9. No person shall in any part of the River Green hawk or sell or offer or expose for sale or let for hire any commodity or article whatsoever.

10. No person shall deliver any address or lecture or take part in any discussion or political meeting or party meeting or meeting for teaching, preaching or singing or play any musical instrument on the River Green without the permission of the Council.

11. No person shall drive or bring or cause to be driven or brought into the River Green any beast or cattle, sheep, goat, pig or other animal for pasturage.

12. No person shall expose for sale or letting any vessel or boat which is moored to the River Green without the permission of the Council.

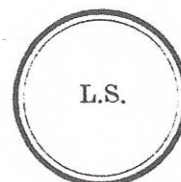
13. No yacht, boat or wherry or other vessel shall be allowed to moor to the River Green except under stress of weather, or except by permission of the Council.

14. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing Bye-Laws shall be liable for every such offence to a Penalty of FORTY SHILLINGS. Provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment, as a penalty, of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this Bye-Law.

15. Nothing contained in any of the foregoing Bye-Laws shall be deemed to be or shall operate as a grant by or on behalf of the Crown, as owner of the foreshore below high water mark, of any estate or interest in or right over such foreshore, or any part thereof, nor shall anything contained in or done under any of the provisions of the foregoing Bye-Laws in any respect prejudice or injuriously affect the rights and interests of the Crown in such foreshore or prevent the exercise thereon of any public rights.

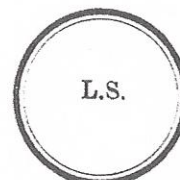

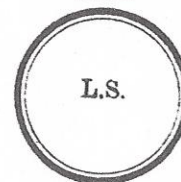
